World News

The main news story for the cycle started on November 13, with public impeachment hearings against the President [1]. This looks similar to the 1868 impeachment of President Andrew Johnson [2]. That impeachment was politically motivated by the then Republican majority. One thing is for certain, as the impeachment effort continues, it distracts from other world events.

For example, the violence in Hong Kong continues. Hong Kong's Hospital Authority indicates at least 116 people were hospitalized due to the rioting [3]. Moreover, police are violating hospital guidance and are interrogating patients while hospitalized [4]. For over a week, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University was besieged by student protesters [5]. The impact of the rioting and protests may soon become known at the ballot box. This as record numbers are lined up to vote in district council elections [6].

Meanwhile, the US Navy deploying two Independence-class ships to the South China Sea [7]. There is concern that as China and US relations deteriorate; increasing the likelihood of a military accident [8]. This comes as China's military warned the US not to provoke an incident after the new Independence-class ships entered the South China Sea [9].

Security

O nce again, the race to keep vulnerable software patched continues. Some samples follow: The Microsoft Patch Tuesday fixed at least 74 product weaknesses [1]. VMware, released patches to fix 5 security vulnerabilities [2]. For October, Oracle released patched to fix 218 issues [3]. Nvidia released patches to fix GeForce vulnerabilities [4].

The previous section highlights the realization that software needs to have secu-

rity patches in order to correct vulnerabilities and exploits. So what happens when the software no longer receives security support? Case in point, on January 14, 2020, Windows 7 will no longer be supported [5]. That is, no future security patches. So this places a burden on those customers that purchased the product to upgrade their software or resolve vulnerabilities through some other approach (that could include accepting the risk).

he economic news, as reflected by stock indices, started on a positive note. On November 4, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA), Standard and Poor's 500 (S&P 500), and National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations (NASDAQ) all set record highs [1]. Then on November 5, the NASDAQ and DJIA again closed at record highs [2]. More records on November 7, when the DJIA and S&P 500 closed at record highs [3]. Then on Friday, November 8, the NASDAQ, DJIA, and S&P 500 closed at record highs [4]. Continuing the trend, on November 13, the DJIA and S&P 500 closed at record highs [5]. On November 14, the S&P 500 closed at a new record high [6]. Hitting a new milestone, on November 15, the three indices closed at record highs with the DJIA closing above 28,000 for the first time [7]. The three indices continued record closes on November 18 [8]. Finally, on November 19, the NASDAQ closed at a new record high [9].

Unemployment indicators also remain high. For the week ending November 2, the number of first time unemployment claims was 211,000 [10]. For the week ending November 9, the number was 225,000 [11]. Finally, for the week ending November 16, the number was 227,000 [12].

On the negative side, there has been an uptick in the number of failed banks. On October 25, the Louisa Community Bank of Kentucky and the Resolute Bank of Ohio were shuttered [13]. Then on November 1, the City National Bank of New Jersey became the 4th shuttered this year [14].
