Many years ago, there was a Navy project, Extremely Low Frequency (ELF), for communicating with submerged submarines [1]. So how did the Navy protect the ELF transmitters from ELF? History suggests the technology to protect power lines has existed for some time. Currently, we are once again we are being warned of the dangers associated with an Electromagnetic Pulse (EMP) attack to the power grid. This time, Air Force Lt. Gen. Steven Kwast sounded the alarm [2]. Instead of protecting the core power grid, money is spent elsewhere. Case in point, the Commonwealth of Virginia is using tax incentives to subsidize inefficient land grabbing solar panels [3]. Conversely, it is estimated that up to 90% of Americans would die within one year following an EMP [4].

Once again, the issue of state sponsored cyber security attacks is in the news. One report indicates, back in 2011 and 2012, Vodafone discovered back doors in Huawei equipment [5]. A different report indicated Huawei has many officials involved in the development of the PLA's electronic warfare capabilities and 98% of the company is owned by Huawei Investment & Holding Trade Union [6]. Additionally, the Dutch intelligence agency AIVD is investigating if China exploited a back door in Huawei equipment to spy on major Dutch telecoms [7]. Perhaps the biggest indicator that China wants to control the fifth generation mobile environment can be seen by the actions taken against Canada. Many months ago, Canada detained Huawei executive Meng Wanzhou for extradition to the US on a number of charges including technology theft, bank fraud, obstruction of justice and money laundering [8]. In response, China arrested Canadian citizens with crimes that could result in death sentence convictions [9]. In the US, the President signed an executive order authorizing the Commerce Secretary to block transactions that threaten communications technology and information [10]. The effort appears to directly challenge Huawei activities in the US [11]. In response, China's Commerce Ministry warned, such actions by the President could escalate tensions [12].

he US Navy has under 300 ships (289) [1]. Meanwhile, China's navy continues to add ships at an accelerated rate. For example, China launched 2 new type 052D guided missile destroyers bringing the number of these ships up to 20 [2]. Additionally, satellite images indicate China is constructing its third aircraft carrier [3]. Current estimates put China's navy at 400 ships with more in the pipeline [4]. In response to aggressive action by Chinese non-Navy ships, the US Navy Admiral John Richardson warned these ships will be treated the same as military assets [5]. In a clear warning, Acting Defense Secretary Patrick M. Shanahan is claimed China's military spending is approaching that of the US [6].

While much has been said regarding Russia's military expansion, they are not in the top 5 list of biggest spenders. Case in point, the top five are (1) United

States, (2) China, (3), Saudi Arabia, (4) India, and (5) France [7].

Meanwhile, the conflict between the Palestinians and Israel heated up. Approximately 600 Palestinian rockets were fired into Israel and Israel hit 280 targets in response [8].

In more good news, the US unemployment rate fell to 3.6% a 49 year low [1]. On April 29, both the S&P 500 and Nasdaq Composite indices closed at new record highs [2]. Then on April 30, the S&P 500 closed at a new record high but the NASDAQ fell [3].

For the week ending April 27, the number of first time unemployment claims was 230,000 [4]. Then for the week ending May 4, the number was 228,000 [5]. Finally, for the week ending May 11, the number of claims was 212,000 [6].

The trade imbalance with China remains problematic. Case in point, the April trade deficit with China was \$21.01 billion [7]. Currently, the US imports \$540 billion in goods from China and exports \$120 billion [8]. Responding to the continuing imbalance and the slow pace of negotiations, the US announced plans to increase tariffs on \$200 Billion wort of imports from china, accusing the communist giant

of reneging on previous vows [9]. The news caused steep declines in the stock market indices [10]. Then China announced tariffs on US goods causing the stock exchanges to fall over 2% [11].
