Security

There seems to be a number of highly visible gas explosions. For example, the Durham, NC explosion 4 months ago [1]. Then the Plantation, Florida explosion that occurred July 6 [2]. The Moreland community, Kentucky gas explosion a month ago [3]. And now a Maryland shopping complex gas explosion [4]. While investigations continue into the causes, we note the role of Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) in critical infrastructure systems, including natural gas. While SCADA may not have been the reason for the examples cited; cybersecurity has a special focus for software and systems used to control the critical infrastructure [5].

When crime pays, the incidents of attack increase. For instance, in Texas, 23 towns were hit by a ransomware attack [6]. Overall, the rate of ransomware attacks is double that of last year [7]. This is probably a justification for backing up important data regularly.

Meanwhile, the race to fix security holes continues. For example, Adobe patches corrected 76 vulnerabilities in the Acrobat and Reader [8]. Additionally Microsoft's patch Tuesday corrected 93 vulnerabilities [9]. Then it was reported that one bug has been with Windows for over 20 years [10]. The question here is how many vulnerabilities exist that have yet to be discovered?

One very troubling aspect of software is the limited support for security patches. Consider Toyota has recall notices for vehicles going back to 2002 [11]. However, it appears Microsoft Windows version 1703, released in 2017, will no longer get security patches [12, 13]. This exposes the risk of unsupported vendor software. So what happens if a software product that no longer has security patch support is used to run critical infrastructure SCADA software? Whereas a software vendor can demand a product be upgrades, regardless of the cost to the consumer; the same logic does not apply to auto manufactures. Would it be acceptable to demand the car owner upgrade to a newer vehicle?

he war in Yemen continues to spill over into Saudi Arabia. For instance, Yemen's Houthi rebels used drone attacks on a Saudi oils field [1]. As an introduction, the population of Hong Kong is approximately 7.5 million people [2]. Following Hong Kong protester shutdowns of the airport, large demonstrations entered the eleventh week of protests [3]. Then on August 18, an estimated at 1.7 million people protested [4]. This

represents a significant portion of the population. Then, despite a ban on marches, Hong Kong protesters continued for a thirteenth week [5]. Finally, on August 31, violent protesters successfully blocked access to the airport [6]. Meanwhile, pressure continues to be applied on Communist China. For instance, the US cleared the sale of \$8 billion in weapons, including 66 new F-16 jet fighters to Taiwan [7].

ews on the unemployment front remains good. For the week ending August 10, the number of first time unemployment claims was 220,000 [1]. Then for the week ending August 17, the number of claims was 209,000 [2]. Finally, for the week ending August 24, the number of claims was 215,000 [3].

The trade war with China is continuing with new tariffs imposed by both sides [4]. As a partial consequence, on August 14, the Dow Jones Industrial Average fell over 800 points (3%) [5]. Additionally, retailers are increasingly using suppliers outside of China [6]. When President Trump came into office, the average tariff on Chinese goods was 3.1 percent; now this is at 21.2 percent [7]. Another oddity is the dollar is getting stronger while the Yuan (Chinese currency) is falling [8]. This may be an indication of Chinese currency manipulation. In conclusion, the effects of the trade war are evident. Case in point; in China, for the fourth month, factory activity contracted and for the fifteenth month, exports fell [9].
