ne report indicates China is expanding its plutonium and uranium plants in support of a rapid buildup of nuclear weapons [1]. Additionally, there is a report that China is conducting genetic engineering to create super soldiers [2]. This comes as China continues to expand its global military capability [3]. Moreover, we should not forget how China used one sided trade became so economically powerful. Case in point, China has imposed a 200% import tax on Australian wines [4].

The Iranian scientist considered the head of Tehran's military nuclear program was killed in an assignation attack in the city of Absard, located to the east of Tehran [5]. There is speculation that Israel may have been involved with the assassination [6]. In response to the attack, Iran's leadership has vowed retaliation [7].

n Monday, November 16, Moderna announced its COVID-19 vaccine clinical test results showed it to be 94.5% effective [1]. Then the Oxford vaccine was shown to be approximately 90% effective [2]. Meanwhile, the head of the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) was called to the White House to supposedly discuss why the vaccine approval process is taking so long [3]. In contrast, the United Kingdom (UK) approved the Pfizer vaccine [4]. In response, Dr. Anthony Fauci told U.S. media outlets; U.K. regulators hadn't acted "as carefully" as the FDA [5].

Had the FDA used the same approval speed as the UK, vaccinations would be well into the second week instead of further delayed. Meanwhile, China appears to be promoting a theory that COVID-19 actually started in Italy and not Wuhan [6]. Separately, one piece suggests China underreported the number of COVID-19 infections and resulting deaths [7]. Concurrently, one piece suggests China is collecting DNA for the purpose of developing bioweapons directed against ethnic people [8]. While we cannot ascertain what bioweapons research, if any, is being

conducted by China; the lack of transparency fuels concern.

With the COVID-19 vaccines starting to roll out, there are those trying to disrupt the distribution. For instance, a state sponsored hacking attack against vaccine distribution was detected [9]. The attack appears to be focused on the cold storage parts of the distribution chain [10].

n November 16, Moderna, the biotechnology company, announced their vaccine was 94.5% effective against COVID-19 [1]. As a result, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) and Standard and Poor's 500 (S&P 500) closed at record highs following news of the second COVID-19 vaccine clinical trial results [2]. Then news came that a third solution, the Oxford vaccine had proven to be 70% effective against the virus [3]. With three COVID-19 vaccines ready for government approval, this helped fuel the stock market indices. Case in point, on November 24, the Dow closed above 30,000 for the first time [4]. Additionally, the S&P 500 also set a new record high [5]. On November 27, both the S&P 500 and NASDAQ Composite closed at record highs [6].
