In the Persian Gulf, the US Navy claimed Iranians were harassing US ships [1]. Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard acknowledged the encounter [2]. In response, President Trump authorized the US Navy to destroy any Iranian asset used to harass US ships [3].

Meanwhile, coronavirus is not the only news coming from China. Reports indicate the communist giant may deploy its Xian H-20 stealth bombers year [4]. This comes as a Chinese newspaper is calling for China to increase its nuclear warheads to 1,000 [5]. China's navy also floated a new assault carrier, the Type-075 class large amphibious warfare ship [6]. The Chinese navy also put two new nuclear powered ballistic-missile submarines into service [7]. Meanwhile, China confidently predicts that Taiwan will not be admitted into the World Health Organization (WHO) [8].

Elsewhere, China continues to assert its military as the COVID-19 pandemic continues. Case in point, China will prohibit fishing activities in the waters Beijing has claimed [9]. For example, Chinese Coast Guard ships chased a Japanese fishing boat in contested waters [10].

Wuhan Coronavirus

aul Ehrlich received a Nobel Prize in Physiology and Medicine in 1908 for his discovery of the arsenic based arsphenamine (Salvarsan); the first known cure for treating syphilis [1]. This was the start of the chemotherapy discipline. That is, using chemicals the body does not produce to kill diseases. So when President Trump suggested looking into disinfectant used within the body to fight COVID-19, the press made this look foolish [2]. However, regardless of the press interpretation, looking into chemotherapy as a solution is a legitimate research top-

At this time, the number of COVID-19 related deaths

has surpassed 78,000 [3] making this pandemic worse than seasonal influenza. However, based on a study of 3,000 people, New York COVID-19 infections are estimated to be 13.9% or 2.7 million people [4]. When the level reaches 70–90 %, it will have reached herd immunity [5].

Meanwhile, reports indicate the World Health Organization (WHO) found no evidence that recovering from the coronavirus prevents reinfection [6]. Does the body forget how it defeated the virus in the first place? Does the virus mutate? Did the patient not recover from the infection but tests showed they had? Many questions, few answers.

With all the hype surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, the military has added a new twist. It seems that the COVID-19 may be a disqualifier for military entrance processing stations [6]. So it appears that if you had the virus, you cannot join the military. If the antibody tests are a correct measure of who had the virus, the military may have a hard time getting recruits. There is a continuing conspiracy by nature theory suggesting the Wuhan coronavirus was the result of natural mutations [7]. The argument is the virus is based on SARS-CoV-2, found in bats. However, short of detecting synthetic

nucleotides, it is infeasible, just by looking at the sequencing, to ascertain if man played a role in the virus. A bioweapon design would start with the bat virus and make slight changes to avoid detection of engineering. So perhaps the best determiner is probability analysis. Is it more probable that such a contagious virus could have mutated from the bat virus as claimed by China or engineered in a lab as suggested by others? In future newsletters, we may explore probability and cumulative distribution functions for the two competing theories to help determine the most likely cause.

Economy

The impact of COVID-19 to the oil industry is devastating. For the first time, oil prices traded in the negative range [1]. That is, oil companies paid customers to take oil off their hands. Moreover, the US economy shrank at a rates of 4.8% during the first quarter [2].

News on the employment front is dismal. Not since the Great Depression, has the US unemployment rate hit 14.7% [3]. The weekly unemployment claims reflects the economic downturn. For the week ending April 18, the number of first time unemployment claims was 4,427,000 [4]. For the week ending April 25, the number reported was 3,839,000 [5]. Finally, for the week ending May 2, the number was 3,169,000 [6]. The cumulative unemployment for the past 7 weeks is 33 million workers [7]. With numbers such as these, recovery will be long.

So the question remains, was the shutdown the best approach for the US? Consider, Sweden did not use a lock down and now appears close to its peak with 3,000 deaths so far [8]. Whereas, the population of Sweden is over 10 million people while the US exceeds 328 million. Sweden reached 3,000 deaths at a time when the US exceeded 74,000. So while there are 32 times more people in the US, the number of deaths is only 25 times greater than Sweden. So right now, the death rate in Sweden is approximately 30% higher per 100,000 people. We will keep our eyes on this for the next newsletter.
