Afghanistan

On July 2, 2021, the US abandoned the Bagram Air Base [1]. By August 15, the Taliban had captures the Air Base, including a base prison that held 5,000 prisoners [2]. Shortly thereafter, the Taliban released all prisoners, including terrorists [3]. As the US was evacuation Kabul, a suicide bomber killed at least 13 American servicemen [4]. We have since learned, the suicide bomber was one of the prisoners freed from the Bagram Air Base prison days earlier [5]. President Biden claims the military is responsible for abandoning Bagram Air Base, the military leaders claim the President gave them little choice [6].

First, there was a report of an explosion of a mosque in central Kabul that killed a number of people [7]. Separately, a suicide bomber killed at least 50 people at the Said Abad mosque, used by the minority Shia Muslim community [8]. The Islamic State claimed responsibility for the attack [9]. Then on October 15, another bombing of a Shiite mosque in southern Afghanistan killed at least 7 people [10]. Once again, ISIS claimed responsibility for the attack that at last count left 47 dead [11]. In another sign of continued terrorism, the Taliban publicly displayed three bodies of alleged criminals in the Obe district in northeast Herat [12].

On the other side, there is good news for the Taliban as they solidify their victory. The US has agreed to provide Afghanistan with humanitarian aid [13]. This comes after the Taliban rejected US support in its war against ISIS [14].

O n October 2, the attack submarine USS Connecticut, suffered an underwater collision with an unknown object, while it was operating in in the South China Sea [1]. It has yet to be disclosed what the sub impacted.

Meanwhile, China continued its bullying of Taiwan. For instance, over a two-day period, the communist giant sent over 80 aircraft into Taiwan's air defense zone [2]. China also claims it conducted military beach landings across from Taiwan [3]. In contrast, Tai-

wan's President Tsai Ingwen has stated that her government would not bow to pressure from Beijing [4]. Concurrently, China continues to prepare for war with Taiwan. For instance, satellite imagery indicates China is upgrading its air bases closest to Taiwan [5]. Elsewhere, Islamic terrorism is taking its toll in the West. In Norway, a 37-yearold Danish convert to Islam, killed at least 5 people with a bow and arrow [6]. On October 15, conservative British member of Parliament, David Amess, died

after being stabbed multiple times during a terrorist attack [7]. UK police are investigating the attacker's motivation as linked to Islamist extremism [8].

COVID-19

The number of COVID-19 deaths in the US surpassed 700,000 [1]. With so many people previously infected and the number of those vaccinated; why are we not in herd immunity? Whereas there may be many reasons, we explore the role of illegal immigrants.

In early March, the infection rate amongst illegal immigrates was under 6% [2]. In contrast, now the head of the Department of Homeland Security Secretary (DHS), Alejandro Mayorkas, estimates 20% of illegal aliens now arrive sick [3]. Another report indicates 18% (20% for unaccompanied minors) of those released from Border Patrol custody tested positive for COVID-19 [4].

Another report indicates that hundreds of children contracted COVID in the overcrowded at the Department Health and Human Services (HHS) migrant shelter in Fort Bliss, Texas [5]. Meanwhile, in Del Rio, Texas, there were reports the Haitian migrants were given a ticket and released into the community [6]. The DHS Secretary estimates 12,000 of the Del Rio migrants were released into the US [7]. Indications are these immigrants were not tested for COVID-19 before being released into the US [8]. So, if we use the 20% estimate for infections, that works out to be 2,400 COVID infected people were released into the US. Another report indicates since March at least 160,000 illegal aliens were released into the US with little oversight [9].

So, the next question is where are these migrants now? One piece indicates the local Governments are not told where and when migrants are released [10]. Interesting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) web page has extensive guidance on contact tracing. So one of the established disease controls is bypassed by the open border policies now in place. In contrast, Anthony Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, claims immigrants are not driving the spread of COVID-19 in the US [11].

Meanwhile, China continues to obstruct any meaningful investigation of the virus origin. Case in point, China denied World Health Organization (WHO) access to bat caves and wildlife farming areas [12].

Economy

The good news is the unemployment rate for September fell to 4.8% [1]. The bad news is the labor force participation rate fell to 61.6% [2]. That is, of the total population of potential workers, only 61.6% are looking for work. So, of the 61.6% looking for work, only 4.8% were unemployed. Conversely, we could say that for September, 43.2% of eligible workers were not working.

Another area of concern is the massive debt the US Government continues to build. The US Senate approved raising the debt ceiling through early December [3]. This is coupled with a rapid increase in inflation. Case in point, the cost-of -living adjustment (COLA) for Social Security benefit receipts will increase by 5.9 percent; the highest in 40 years [4].

For the week ending September 25, the number of firsttime unemployment claims reported by the Department of Labor was 362,000 [5]. For the week ending October 2, the number reported was 326,000 [6]. Finally, for the week ending October 9, the number reported was 293,000 [7].

All is not well in China. One of the largest developers, Ever-

grande, is missing bond payments [8]. Then Chinese developer Sinic Holdings was at risk of missing bond payments [9].
