# Afghanistan

By one account, approximately 450 Americans are still trapped in Afghanistan [1]. This comes as acts of terrorism continue. For instance, at least 19 people were killed by two explosions in the capital, Kabul [2]. The attack was directed against the Sardar Mohammad Dawood Khan military hospital [3]. The Taliban now controlling Afghanistan blamed ISIS-K for the attack [4]. Elsewhere, in Jalalabad, a roadside bomb explosion killed at least two people [5].

Back in August, the Taliban indicated they wanted a peaceful transition [6]. However, early on there were indications of brutal killings [7]. Nevertheless, some have wondered if the Taliban will renounce terrorism. Perhaps their actions answer this question. For instance, one report indicates the Taliban will reward the families of suicide bombers with money and land [8]. In another example, a Taliban commander who ran suicide bombers in Kabul is now the police chief for that city [9]. Another report indicates the Taliban beheaded a female volleyball player and posted the images to social media [10]. In another instance, three people were shot and killed for playing music at a wedding [11]. In the northern city of Mazar-i-Sharif, four women lured into believing they were evacuating Afghanistan were instead killed [12]. In any case, the outlook for women in Afghanistan appears to be more restricted. Case in point, Al-Qaeda warned women to be traditional; not feminist [13].

hina continues to advance its military technology. Case in point, the communist giant launched a nuclear capable hypersonic missile into orbit [1]. The Chinese test reportedly caught the US off guard [2]. If true, this would suggest the US intelligence capability on Chinese activities is waning. Moreover, China's 355 ship navy is the largest on Earth [3].

errorism is not limited to actual attacks but includes threat of violence. Case in point, malls and shopping centers in the Northern Virginia are were put on alert for an expected ISIS attack [1]. Unfortunately, the US infrastructure is vulnerable to terrorist attacks. For example, information has been revealed that back in July, 2020, there was an attempted drone attack against a Pennsylvania substation [2]. The drone was devoid of markings and contained two copper attached 4-foot nylon ropes that appear to be designed to short circuit power lines [3].

Afghanistan is not the only center for ongoing terrorism.

For instance, in an area (southwest Niger) overrun by an affiliate of the Islamic State (IS), gunmen killed at least 69 people [4]. A 27-year-old Syrian man was arrested in Seubersdorf, Germany, for allegedly stabbing three people on a train [5]. A bombing near the entrance of Yemen's Aden airport killed at least six people [5].

he stock market indexes continue to set record highs. On October 21, the S&P 500 closed at a new record high [1]. Then, on October 22, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (Dow) closed at a new record high [2]. On October 25, both the S&P 500 and the Dow set new record highs [3]. Then again on October 26, the Dow and S&P 500 hit new record highs [4]. On October 21, both the Nasdag and S&P 500 closed at new record highs [5]. Then on October 28, all three indexes closed at record highs [6]. November 1 started with the three indexes again setting new record highs [7]. The three indexes continued setting records on November 2 with the DJIA ending above 36,000 for the first time [8]. The three indexes continued record closes on November 3 [9]. On November 4, the DJIA paused but the S&P 500 and Nasdaq closed at record highs [10]. On the last trading day of this newsletter (November 5) the three indexes again closed at record highs [11].

Disappointing economic growth. The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew at a 2.0% annual rate for the third quarter [12]. That is, the GDP only grew by 0.5% during the quarter. However, the unemployment rate for October fell to 4.6% and the labor force participation rate unchanged at 61.6% [13].

For the week ending October 16, the number of first-time unemployment claims, reported by the Department of Labor, was 290,000 [14]. For the week ending October 23, the

number reported was 281,000 [15]. Finally, for the week ending October 30, the number reported was 269,000 [16].
