## World News

n January 17, Senator Graham pointed out that Speaker Pelosi was responsible for Capitol security [1]. To further explore this assertion, we checked on the House of Representatives web site and found the duties of the House Sergeant at Arms (SAA) is responsible for Capitol complex security [2]. That person was Paul D. Irving, who resigned the day after the Capitol building was seized [3]. The outgoing Capitol Police Chief, Chief Steven Sund, is reported to have asked the House SAA for National Guard; Mr. Irving was reported to have respond that he'd have to ask House leaders [4]. It is unclear is the request made it to House leaders. However, six months prior, in response to the BLM riots against the White House, Speaker Pelosi criticized the President's use of the military. "I don't think the president's calling out the military are warranted' [5]. The question here is was there any pressure to avoid a military presence prior to the seize?

For comparison, some examples of the damage from the BLM riots: At the Veterans Affair Headquarters, windows were smashed, monuments damaged, a car set on fire, and curse words spray painted onto the building [6]. Nearby, the historic St. John's Church was set afire [7]. The rioters also threw incendiary devices, vandalized commercial property, injured at least 11 DC police officers, and injured 60 secret service agents [8].

On the first night of President Biden's term, approximately 150 organized rioters in Portland carried shields, rocks, and stun guns, damaged a Federal ICE building [9]. The question here is why are any violent riots against Federal property still allowed?

Meanwhile, President Biden announced the US will return to the Pairs Climate Accord [10]. This as China installed three times more coal fired power plant during 2020 than the rest of the world combined [11]. This is great news for China's industry as this will help its products be more cost competitive.

uring this time, Johnson & Johnson has requested an emergency use authorization for its single shot COVID-19 vaccination [1]. Concurrently, in the US, over 450,000 people have died from COVID -19 related sickness [2]. As a follow-up, one piece is asking the question, what can be done to stop the next coronavirus from China [3]. This comes as one report suggests China is trying to get DNA on U.S. citizens

[4]. Another report indicates Chinese military involvement with the company harvesting Western DNA via COVID-19 tests [5]. Perhaps gathering such information is benign. However, if China is developing bio-weapons, we could be looking as viruses that target people based on their ethnicity.

Meanwhile, a year after the COVID-19 outbreak, the World Health Organization (WHO) is in Wuhan looking for clues as to the origin of the virus [6]. This visit includes examining the now closed fish market [7]. It is unclear what the WHO hopes to uncover from such a visit this late in the game. Additionally, 80 people were arrested in China for counterfeiting and selling fake COVID vaccines [8]. Finally, on February 7, 2020, the whistleblower who warned about what became

n election day, January 20, the three indexes (DJIA, S&P 500, and Nasdaq) closed at record highs [1]. Then on the 21<sup>st</sup>, the Nasdaq and S&P 5000 continued record closes [2]. On Monday, January 25, the Nasdaq and S&P 500 both set record high closes [3]. Additionally, on February 4, the S&P 500 and Nasdaq closed at record highs [4]. Then on February 5, the Nasdaq and S&P 500 closed at new record highs [5].
