The Suez Canal was shut down was shut down when a large cargo got stuck sideways [1]. The question here is how did this event happen? While some have suggested the wind was responsible; others cast doubt that 30 Mile Per Hour gusts were responsible [2]. One estimate placed the number of ships waiting to transit the canal at 321 [3]. By March 29, the ships was finally freed [4]. The next day, an inquiry as to the cause of the blockage began [5]. Readers may recall the US Navy 7th Fleet ship collisions with commercial vessels [6]. Could the Suez Canal event be a cyber-attack?

On December 15, 1978, President Carter announced the US would recognize Communist China and sever its diplomatic relations with Taiwan [7]. The consequences of the decision are now being played out. For example, China is stepping up war exercises around Taiwan [8]. In response to the continued aggression by China, Taiwan leaders vow to fight to the end if attacked [9]. A question here is had President Carter not severed ties with Taiwan, would the world be a safer place?

China also is using its military and economic power to do as it pleases. For instance, a Chinese research ship is drilling in waters claimed by other countries [10]. Additionally, China has amassed large fleets of fishing vessels that were fishing in waters claimed by the Philippines [11].

The situation within the Ukraine is back in the news. President Biden has assured the Ukraine of his support to that nation [12]. This comes as the Russian military buildup is threatening peace between Russia and the Ukraine [13]. In response, President Biden is heightening the US military presence in that area [14].

Wuhan Coronavirus

The former director of the CDC announced his belief that COVID-19 originated in a lab in Wuhan, China [1]. As expected the World Health Organization (WHO) team expressed their belief that the COVID-19 virus jumped to humans from animals [2]. This comes after reports indicate the team based their summary on Chinese officials inputs [3].

Prior to examining the final report, we fed the new information into the Artificial Intelligence confidence assessment. The likelihood of a lab leak remains above 90% with all other likelihoods combined well below 10%.

Meanwhile, in the US, the number of deaths tied to COVID-19 passed 560,000 [4]. Within the US, over 178 million vaccine doses have been administered so far [5]. While the tide is turning within the US, Brazil is experiencing a significant increase in COVID related deaths [6]. Thus far in Brazil, over 345,000 people have died

from COVID-19 [7].

It appears the COVID-19 virus will be with us for the foreseeable future. For example, the variant of the virus ravaging Brazil is also on the rise within the US [8]. Additionally, the UK variant of the virus now dominates the number of new infections within the US [9].

Ith respect to unemployment and trade deficits, the economy is down. For example, the number of first time unemployment claims reported by the Department of Labor for the week ending March 20 was 684,000 [1]. For the week ending March 27, the number reported was 719,000 [2]. Finally, for the week ending April 3, the number reported was 744,000 [3]. Meanwhile, the trade deficit for February set a new record of \$71.1 billion [4]. In contrast, for March, the unemployment rate fell to 6% as non-farm payrolls expanded by 916,000 [5].

When examined through the prism of the stock market, the economy is robust. For the first time ever, the Standard and Poor's (S&P) 500 index closed above 4,000 [6]. On April5, the S&P 500 continued into record close territory
