ran announced its Natanz site nuclear facility was subjected to a nuclear terrorism and sabotage cyber-attack [1]. The first indication of the attack was a blackout at the facility [2]. Then a missile was fired from Syria deep into Israel, near a nuclear reactor [3]. In response Israel hit sites in Syria [4]. Meanwhile, President Biden is trying to renegotiate a nuclear deal with Iran [5]. As a reminder, an Israel official pointed out its warplanes were within range of Iran [6]. What's more, three Iranian vessels were given a warning shot after closing in on a US patrol boat [7].

In Asia, China continues to use its military to pressure other countries. China issued a landform survey report on the Senkaku Islands and claims to be exercising military restraint [8]. Meanwhile, China commissioned three warships on one day; a 10,000-ton Type 055 cruiser, a 35,000-ton type 075 amphibious helicopter carrier, and a Type 094 nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarine [9]. China is also suspected in cyber-attacks directed at a number of Japanese aerospace companies [10].

World-wide, the number of dead tied to COVID-19 passed the 3 million mark [1]. One of the leaders in manufacturing COVID-19 vaccines is China [2]. However, it appears that the Chinese vaccine is not very effective [3]. Following news of the poor performance, China is now involved in damage control [4].

Meanwhile, one report indicates that China has been involved with a disinformation campaign regarding the origin of the virus [5]. For instance, Chinese media continues to blame a US military lab for the virus [6]. What we can infer is that China believes it will be shown that COVID-19 was an engineered pathogen. The disinformation campaign appears to be designed to shift the blame elsewhere.

The virus has a way to go before world-wide containment. For instance, India is now being ravaged by the virus [7]. For instance, during the last 24 hours of this newsletter reporting period,

India had 3,689 deaths and over 400,000 new reported cases of COVID-19 [8]. Similarly, in Brazil, the number of dead tied to COVID-19 has passed 400,000 [9].

he stock markets continl ued to advance into record territory. On April 15, the DJIA closed above 34,000 for the first time and the S&P 500 closed at a new record high [1]. The two indexes continued into record highs again on April 16 [2]. Then, April 29 saw the S&P 500 close at a new record high [3]. However, the economy as measured by the number of first time unemployment claims remains weak. For the week ending April 10, the number of first time unemployment claims was 576,000 [4]. For the week ending April 17, the number reported was 547,000 [5]. Finally, for the week ending April 24, the number reported was 553,000 [6].

While the US continues to recover from the COVID economic impact, China is rapidly expanding. Case in
