In Asia, North Korea launched two more ballistic missiles claiming they were tests for delivering nuclear weapons against South Korea [1]. One report suggests North Korea is prepared to conduct a nuclear weapons test at any time [2]. This comes as Washington warned North Korea that any new nuclear weapons tests would be met with a significant response [3]. Concurrently, some are suggesting that it is time to recognize North Korea as a nuclear weapons power [4]. With China backing North Korea, it's unclear what effective response Washington could implement.

Meanwhile, China is on the fast track to take Taiwan [5]. By one estimate, the invasion of Taiwan could take place at any time [6].

In the last newsletter, we discussed how Russia could move assets into the US through the open US Southern border. Now Russia is warning at all energy infrastructures are fair targets because of the attack on the Nord Stream pipelines [7].

Ukraine War

A truck bomb explosion damaged the bridge connecting Russia to the Crimea [1]. Russia called the attack an act of terrorism [2]. In response, Russia launched a missile attack hitting targets throughout the Ukraine [3]. Additionally, Russia is blaming the United Kingdom for sabotaging the Nord Stream gas pipelines [4].

Meanwhile, Russia is using Kamikaze drones supplied by Iran to attack targets withing the Ukraine [5]. This comes as Russia President Putin claims he has no

plans to use nuclear weapons in the Ukraine [6]. In the US, 30 members of President Biden's political party are calling for the president to move away from the current Ukrainian policy and instead seek a negotiated peace [7]. However, the request was pulled less than 24-hours later following concerns over support to the Ukraine [8]. There was a significant attack by Ukrainian forces against Russia's Black Sea fleet [9]. In response, Russia announced it will stop a previous deal that allowed grain shipments out of the

Ukraine by sea [10].

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) came in at 8.2% over this time last year [1]. Meanwhile, the average interest rate on home mortgages rose to 7.16%, the highest since 2001 [2].

On the plus side, the third quarter Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew at a 2.6% rate [3]. This implies we are not in a recession. Additionally, the draw down from the Strategic Oil Reserve on fear of recession has moved gasoline prices lower [4].
