The giant cryptocurrency exchange FTX is seeking bankruptcy protection [1]. By one estimate, at the start of the week, the FTX CEO Bankman-Fried was worth about \$16 billion, by week's end he was worth \$0 [2]. One report indicates over one billion dollars of cryptocurrency is missing and during close examination, a back door in FTX's books was discovered [3]. On November 11, \$663 million mysteriously flowed out of wallets linked to FTX with an estimated \$477 million stolen [4].It is unclear if malware is responsible for any of the FTX losses. However, the US Army and CDC were using code developed from Russian sources that claimed to be American made [5].

In Asia, North Korea continues to make regional neighbors worried. For instance, on November 2, the North launches 23 missiles; the next day approximately 180 warplanes were detected in flight [6]. Then on November 8, the North Koreans launched an Intercontinental Ballistic Missile with an estimated range capable of hitting the USA [7].

It would appear that China has been involved with targeting democratic elections in North America. For instance, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau accused China of interference that took place in 2019 elections [8]. In the Unites States, a Chinese plot to smear Congress was exposed [9].

Ukraine War

n November 15, there was a report that Russian made missile struck Poland (a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO)), killing at least two people [1]. The main concern is that the attack could draw NATO into a larger war [2]. For instance, in response to the attack, President Biden called for an emergency meeting with NATO leaders [3]. Russia denied it had launched the attack [4]. One report indicates President Biden does not believe the missile was fired by Russia [5]. In response, Ukrainian President Zelen-

skyy asserted the missile was not from his country [6]. Meanwhile, the war in Ukraine is not going well for Russia. The latest Russian setback is the loss of Kherson city [7]. What's more, there are reports of Russian war crimes that took place in the city [8]. Ukraine President Zelensky declared the victory in Kherson is the beginning of the end for the Russia invasion [9].

However, one piece suggests Russia is buying time to prepare its new conscripts for winter action [10]. For instance, on No-

vember 15, Russia fired approximately 100 missiles into Ukraine that caused widespread power outages [11]. Meanwhile, President Biden is requesting \$37 Billion in emergency aid for the Ukraine [12].

Elsewhere, in the northwestern governorate of Kirkuk, Iraq, Islamic State militants killed at least 4 soldiers [4]. Last October, the Nord Stream pipeline was damaged due to multiple explosions [5]. Now Swedish investigators found explosive residue indicating sabotage [6].

ollowing World War I, Germany's massive debt led to hyperinflation. Case in point, in the year 1923, 42 billion German marks were worth the equivalent of one American cent [1]. Should the US experience hyperinflation; one consequences could be the total collapse of the banking system [2]. In order to combat inflation, the Fed hiked its rate by 0.75 percentage points [3]. However, in positive news, the Consumer Price Index (CPI), year-overvear inflation rate fell to 7.7% [4].

The unemployment rate for October increased to 3.7% [5]. What's more, the average price per gallon of gasoline fell to \$3.671 [6]. Finally, the loss estimate for the failed FTX cryptocurrency exchange is estimated to exceed \$10 Billion [7].
