
Ukraine War

oth Finland and Sweden officially applied for membership into the North Atlantic Treaty Organf D ization (NATO) [1]. Meanwhile, the US continues to get more involved with the Ukraine war. For instance, President Biden signed a \$40 billion aid package [2]. This amount is over half what Russia spends annually on its military [3]. Moreover, this comes as the last Ukrainian forces in the city of Mariupol surrendered to Russian forces [4]. Russian forces appear to be using the Mariupol bombardment tactic on the city of Severodonetsk [5]. Overall, Russia is making military progress [6].

Meanwhile, Russia continues to receive help from other countries. For example, China is now importing more Russian coal than ever [7]. Commerce between Russia and India is providing access to equipment otherwise banned under Western sanctions [8]. Germany and Italy are still purchasing Russian gas [9].

It is difficult to know what the US plans for Ukraine actually are. Case in point, the Administration confirmed it would not provide long range missiles to the Ukraine [10]. In a change of policy, the Administration said it would [11].
