World News

The Chinese military continues to expand. For instance, China now leads the US nuclear arsenal in some areas [1]. Meanwhile, China 's military continues its aggressive behavior. For example, China and Indian forces clashed on the eastern tip of India [2]. This comes as India test fired a nuclear capable missile with a range of 3,300 miles [3]. Additionally, China's air force continues to probe Taiwan air defenses [4]. One consequence is that Japan is now committed to offensive first strike weapons [5]. Concurrently, Japan is reversing its approach and is instead embracing nuclear energy [6,7]. This should provide Japan with additional plutonium should it decides to develop nuclear weapons [8].

China is also experiencing a surge in COVID-19 cases. This is because the communist leadership decision to relax COVID quarantine policy [9]. One report indicates some hospitals are full and turning away more patients [10]. Moreover, there are reports that China is not sharing the latest COVID information with the World Health Organization [11].

On December 18, North Korea launched two ballistic missiles capable of hitting Japan [12]. The North also claimed they tested a spy satellite releasing low quality images of South Korea [13]. Then on December 23, the North fired two additional ballistic missiles [14]. The North also launched drones into South Korean airspace [15]. On December 31, North Korea launched three ballistic missiles [16]. During 2022, the North fired over 70 ballistic missiles and is committed to expanding its nuclear arsenal [17].

Once again, the US critical infrastructure came under attack. For example, in Washington State, four electrical substations were damaged resulting in over 10,000 people without power [18].

Ukraine War

he Chinese President, Xi, is advising Russia to have talks with the Ukraine [1]. What's more, Russian President Putin said he wants to end the war in the Ukraine [2]. In contrast, the US is preparing to ship more advanced weapons to the Ukraine [3]. Meanwhile, North Korea is believed to be providing Russia with military aid [4]. While Russian forces continue to attack targets in the Ukraine, there are indi-

cations that they are building strength within Belarus [5]. Another report suggests Russian electronic warfare is becoming more effective against Ukrainian drones [6].

There are indications that the war in the Ukraine is closer to expanding. Case in point, a Ukrainian air defense missile was shot down over Russian ally, Belarus [7]. This has caused increased tension between Belarus and the Ukraine [8].

We can expect the war will continue well into 2023. For example, prior to and flowing the new year's celebrations, Russian attacks hit Ukrainian targets [9].

Economy

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) was 7.1% from a year ago [1]. This suggests the trend is moving toward less inflation as shown in the graph below. Nevertheless, the Fed raised the federal funds interest rates by 0.5%, its highest since December 2007 [2].

Another measure of economic growth is the stock market. By this measure, 2022 was a bad year. For example, the three major indexes were down with losses mot seen since 2008 [3].
