Tension between the US and China continues to escalate. Chinese Foreign Minister Qin Gang warned the US, conflict is inevitable unless Washington changes course [1]. Meanwhile, China threatened the US with unspecified consequences following the US Navy warship, USS Milius, operating in the South China Sea [2]. This comes as Russia is reportedly providing uranium to China for its reactors used to make nuclear weapons [3].

Meanwhile, North Korean forces launched another intercontinental ballistic missile on March 16 [4]. The North also tested a nuclear-capable underwater attack drone [5].

Once again, military action in Syria is heating up. A US base was struck by an Iranian drone, resulting in the death of one American contractor [6]. In response, the US launched airstrikes against Iranian-affiliated targets in Syria [7]. Then there was a missile attack directed against a US base [8]. The Iranian affiliated response included attacks at a second US base [9]. Finally, Syria's President Bashar al-Assad condemned the US raid [10].

Ukraine War

The Nord Stream explosions have become a highly sensitive geopolitical issue [1]. A new report suggests the Nord Stream pipeline attack was carried out by a pro-Ukrainian group [2]. However, Germany is advising caution over the new report [3]. Finally, there are some asking if the US raised a false flag to divert attention from its actions [4].

Reports suggest the war is not going well for Russia.

Case in point, during Senate testimony, Director of National Intelligence Avril Haines claimed that for the remainder of this year, Russia lacks the men and material to take any significate territory in the Ukraine [5]. The Ukraine war continues to inch the world closer to nuclear confrontation. For instance, Russian President Putin is reported to deploy nuclear weapons in Belarus [6]. This will be the first time since the mid-1990's

that Russia has stationed tactical nuclear weapons outside of Russia [7].

Terrorism directed at religions continues. For instance, in Hamburg, Germany, at least 7 people died during a mass shooting at a Jehovah's Witnesses Kingdom Hall [1].

In Afghanistan, an Islamic State (IS) suicide bomber killed Taliban governor of Afghanistan's northern Balkh province [2]. Elsewhere, the Taliban claims to have killed three Islamic State fighters during a Kabul raid [3].

The IS continues active terrorism in Syria. For example, at least 15 bodies of people kidnapped by the IS were found [4].

- n March 9, SVB Financial Group's stock plunged 60% [1]. In just 48 hours, the Silicon Valley Bank (SVB) collapsed with the FDIC named receiver on March 10 [2]. The SVB was the second largest bank failure in the US [3]. Then on March 12, the Signature Bank in New York was shuttered [4]. The Signature Bank became the third largest bank failure to date [5]. In a further sign of bank weaknesses, on March 16, the First Republic Bank received a \$30 billion lifeline from group of larger banks [6].
- The February unemployment rate was 3.6% [7]. Then on March 22, the Fed lifted its benchmark federal funds rate by a quarter of a percentage point [8].
