While most of the world's attention is focused on the Middle-East and Russian activities: China continues to enhance its military capability. For instance, China conducted its eighth test of an antisatellite missile [3].

What's more, as China continues to expand its wealth and industry, the problems of pollution grow. For instance, in parts of north-east China, new air pollution records were set with some levels reaching 56 times the safe limit [4]. People living in the smog in the city of Shenyang experienced reduced visibility with buildings shrouded in toxic clouds [5]. Concurrently, China is continuing to use its newfound wealth to advance in the technology area. Case in point, as the list of top 500 supercomputers in the world showed a reduction in US machines to 200, China increased to 109; including the one rated the most powerful [6].

Elsewhere in Asia, Japan decided to rely of the US for its military to patrol the South China Sea and not commit any of its navy ships [7]. This is a significant win for China's claim to the important trade route.

Security

pproximately 200,000 Comcast customers were advised to change their passwords after private accounts were auctioned on an underground dark web site [1]. Meanwhile, US prosecutors announced criminal charges against three men charged in the 2014 JPMorgan Chase & Co attack of 83 million customer accounts that netted hundreds of millions of dollars in illegal profit [2].

One report indicates that half of developers rush mobile applications to market with security as a secondary consideration [3]. Regardless of how vulnerabilities make it into software, keeping software up to date with security fixes continues to be a challenge. For instance, Microsoft's patch Tuesday for November addresses several critical vulnerabilities that if left un -fixed, could allow remote code execution [4]. Shortly

thereafter, Microsoft released another patch to fix problems detected in the first patch [5]. Likewise, Adobe's patch fixed 17 critical vulnerabilities [6]. This was followed by another out of cycle patch to fix non-Flash products [7]. What the Microsoft and Adobe examples show is the challenge in getting security fixes out quickly while maintaing code quali-

Terrorism

An Islamic State (IS) terrorist attack in Paris left at least 127 people dead [1]. Among the first responses from France was dropping 20 bombs on IS targets in Styria [2], In a Paris suburb, two suspected terrorists were killed during a seven hour standoff, including a female suicide bomber who detonated explosives [3].

In the Middle East, the Islamic State (IS) continues to use suicide bombers as a weapon. For instance, in Beirut, twin attacks against a Hezbollah stronghold left at least 43 people dead [4].

Meanwhile, Russian officials confirmed the crashed airliner was brought down by a bomb and places the blame on Islamic Terrorists [5]. This comes as the top Democratic on the Senate Intelligence Committee, Dianne Feinstein, pointed out the IS isn't contained [6].

One thing we currently do not see in Western cities; people with gas masks and other protective gear. However, in the near this might well change. Case in point, the IS terrorist group is determined to produce chemical weapons [7]. This follows previous reports supporting the claim the IS developed and used chemical weapons in Syria [8]. The question here is when will

such weapons be used against soft targets in Western cities? Then Islamic terrorist attacked a hotel in the African nation of Mali [9]. The hotel was frequented by foreign travelers. Case in point, among the victims were three Chinese businessmen [10].

For October, US imports to China fell by 18.8% compared to last year [1]. Perhaps this is why the September trade deficit of \$40.8B included an all-time high with China of \$36.3B [7]. Stated another way, 89% of the US trade deficit is now with China. Meanwhile, during the July-September quarter, Japan's economy contracted 0.2% highlighting a slip back into an economic recession [2].
