## World News

In Syria, there are reports the Government is repelling a large scale rebel attack in the northern city of Aleppo [1]. Concurrently, Turkey attacked Islamic State (IS) targets located 12 km south of the Turkey/Syria border [2].

In the South China Sea, China continues to flex its military muscle. For instance, the Xinhua state news agency announced military exercise later this month that will include advanced warships and submarines [3]. This comes as China has built a series of artificial island that recovered 3,200 aces in the South China Sea [4]. Moreover, there are concerns that China may build an eighth island on Scarborough Shoal; a location much closer to Manila [5]. China's response to reports of its military buildup was to criticize the US for overstating the threat [6].

During the last year, the US Army has reduced its size by 16,548, reaching a reduced force seen only prior to World War II [7]. This comes as China continues to expand its military growth [8]. For instance, China is building ballistic and cruise missiles with a reach extending to Guam [9]. In response to the Chinese navy expansion, one study concludes more submarines and fewer carriers are needed [10]. However, by one estimate, within 10 years China is expected to have twice the number of submarines as does the US [11].

he Islamic State (IS) L claimed responsibility for a car bomb explosion at a Baghdad market that killed at least 64 people [1]. In a separate attack, IS terrorists attacked a Baghdad gas plant killing 5 police officers [2]. This attack was described as a suicide attack with the overall death toll of at least 11 [3]. Additionally, IS terrorists attacked a café frequented by sports fans, killing at least 12 people [4]. The IS bombings are causing the Iraqi army to divert forces. Case in point, half of the army is tasked with protecting the capitol, Baghdad [5].

The IS was also active in Yemen with an estimated 25 dead from suicide bombings [6]. On the plus side, one report indicates the IS has declared a state of emergency for its capital Raqqa, Syria [7] Elsewhere in Syria, a Hezbollah military leader was killed during an artillery attack [8].

## **Economy**

Regulators continued to close banks. The First CornerStone Bank in Pennsylvania became the third financial institution shuttered so far this year [1]. In another sign of economic trouble ahead, Aeropostale filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy and announced plans to shutter 154 of its stores [2].

According to the Labor Department, for the week ending April 30 the number of first time unemployment claims was 274,000 [3]. Then for the following week, the number reported was 294,000 [4].

Overall, the employment picture leaves much room for improvement. In addition to over 94 million Americans no

longer in the workforce, 5.9 million part time workers indicated they would like full time work [5].

Perhaps the best measure of the weak economy is the number of people within the middle class. One piece indicates, since 2000 the America Middle Class has decreased, with households in 203 of the 229 metropolitan areas falling [6].
