World News

The conflict between Russia and Ukraine continues to expand. Russia announced plans to conduct nuclear weapons drills in response to deepening Western involvement in the war [1]. This comes as Russia continued targeting the Ukrainian power grid [2]. Then, they launched new ground attacks in Northern Ukraine [3]. Meanwhile, a Ukrainian drone struck an oil refinery located in Russia's Kaluga region [4]. Another report indicates approximately 12 missiles were fired at Russian targets in Belgorod, killing at least 15 people in an apartment building [5].

For years, there have been warnings that Iran was close to developing nuclear weapons [6]. Moreover, the United Nations nuclear watchdog warned Iran is not fully transparent [7]. Now, one Iranian law-maker claims Iran already has nuclear weapons [8].

Israel War

The fighting between Israel and Hezbollah continues [1]. The intensified fighting is costing Israel losses [2]. Hezbollah launched a rocket attack from Lebanon that ignited a number of fires in Northern Israel [3]. Moreover, Hezbollah is now using more advanced weapons, including drones capable of launching missiles [4].

Peace talks continue to stop the fighting but issues remain [5]. President Biden is withholding military aid to Israel in an attempt to force the Jewish state to agree to

the Hamas accepted cease-
fire [6]. Another report
indicates the US is negotiat-
ing with Iran to contain the
conflict [7]

Meanwhile, the Houthis in Yemen continue to attack commercial ships. For instance, a Panamanianflagged oil tanker was struck by anti ship missile fire [8].The Houthis also claim to have shot down a US MQ-9 Reaper drone [9].


The stock market indexes continue to shine. On May 14, the NASDAQ closed at a record high [1]. Then on May 15, all three indexes (DJIA, S&P 500, and NASDAQ) closed at record highs [2]. On May 16, the DJIA briefly broke through the 40,000 mark for the first time [3]. Finally, on May 17, the DJIA closed above 40,000 for a new record high [4].

Meanwhile, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase was 0.3% for April or 3.4% year-to year [5].
