## World News

Restimated 700 people were killed in the DR Congo fighting [2,3]. By February 6, the number of people killed increased to 3,000 [4]. Then around February 10, the Rwandan-backed M23 rebels attacked Congolese government forces in the South Kivu province [5]. Reports indicate the rebels were closing in on a second major city, Bukavu [6]. Then on February 14, reports indicated the rebels had entered the city [7].

Near the Suez, Canal, the US aircraft carrier, Harry S. Truman, was damaged in a collusion with a commercial vessel [8]. The collision occurred just before midnight with a Panamanian-flagged bulk cargo ship (with a length of 620 feet and a width of 105 feet) [9].

In Somalia, US forces struck Islamic State operatives [10]. Meanwhile, the Islamic State struck military bases in Somalia's northeastern Puntland state [11].

In Asia, China is constructing the world's largest military building complex in the capital, Beijing [12]. In the South China Sea, Chinese forces were deployed to counter US military exercises in contested waters [13].
