World News

The war between Russia and Ukraine continues. On June 23-24, Russian attacks in Dnipro and Kyiv killed dozens of citizens [1]. This comes as Russia is increasing its Ukraine attacks [2,3,4]. Additionally, one estimate places the number of North Koren troops going to support Russia will reach 30,000 [5]. Moreover, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has offered Russia unconditional support for its war with Ukraine [6].

By one estimate, China spends the same on its defense as does the US [7]. In a new complication, a Chinese official asserted his country would not accept Russia losing the war [8]. In Asia, two Chinese ships entered the Japanese territorial waters around the disputed Senkaku Islands [9].

Meanwhile, there are indications China is supporting Iran's military. This includes materials for making ballistic missiles [10]. China may have provided Iran with advanced J-10C fighters and is open to supplying air defense systems [11].

n June 23, Iran fired missiles at a US military base located in Qatar [1]. President Trump indicated 14 missiles were fired, 13 intercepted, and one allowed to travel in a nonthreatening direction [2]. Israel officials indicated they struck the Evin Prison in Tehran and roads leading to the Fordo uranium enrichment plant previously struck by US B-2 bombers [3]. Shortly thereafter, President Trump announced a peace agreement that ended the 12-day conflict [4].

Meanwhile, other peace efforts continue. On July 2, Israel agreed to a 60-day Gaza ceasefire negotiated by President Trump [5]. There is also a report that there are negotiations between Israel and Syria [6].

However, the Houthis in Yemen have resumed targeting commercial ships in the Red Sea. For example, two ships were sunk within one week [7].

In Syria, a suicide bomber attacked a Christian church, killing at least 20 people [1]. On June 28, a suicide bomber struck a Pakistani

military convoy in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's North Waziristan district, killing at least 13 soldiers [2].

The US is experiencing domestic terrorism directed against Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) personnel. For example, in McAllen, Texas, a gunman ambushed US Border Patrol agents and was killed during the exchange [3]. Elsewhere, 10 people were arrested for an armed attack on the ICE Prairieland Detention Center outside of the Dallas-Fort Worth [4]. In Portland, Oregon, rioters attacked an ICE facility using knives and explosives [5]. In Camarillo, California, ICE agents were fired

upon during a Marijuana farm raid [6].

The US Gross Domestic Product (GDP) contracted at a 0.5% rate for the first quarter [1]. On the positive side, the unemployment rate for June fell from 4.2 to 4.1%

On June 27 and 30, both the Nasdaq and the S&P 500 stock indexes reached fresh all-time highs [3,4]. On July 2, the S&P 500 closed at a record high [5]. On July 3, both the S&P 500 and Nasdaq stock indexes reached new record highs [6]. On July 10, both the Nasdaq and S&P 500 stock indexes closed at record highs [7].

Meanwhile, the tariff negotiations continue. The Administration announced a trade deal with Vietnam where their goods would be tariffed at 20% and US goods at 0% [8].
